• Why would it be desirable for you to be a core participant?

SSPA is a peak body for child and family services approved under section 396 (and section 403) of the Oranga Tamariki Act 1989. Members of SSPA have been providers of care services in the period the Inquiry is considering and are expecting to have engagement with the Royal Commission including being called to give evidence. SSPA is supporting its members to engage with the Royal Commission and can provide useful contextual advice to the Inquiry.

SSPA is an incorporated society and a registered charity, with a membership of over 200 provider organisations.
